<p>Short Description of the Project idea</p>	<p><i>The Balkan Summer School on Religion and Public Life</i> (BSSRPL) (https://logos.uni-plovdiv.net/en/web/logos.etn/bssrpl) has been organized bi-yearly since 2011 as a unique pedagogical project where participants and organizers work together to develop strategies of learning to “live with difference” without trivializing, marginalizing or denying these differences.</p> <p>The goal of the BSSRPL is to provide a laboratory for the practical pedagogy of tolerance and living with difference in a global society. We attract participants (ages from mid-20’s to mid 60’s) from many nations and diverse backgrounds, who, jointly, create a space of interaction within which they are moved to new understandings of themselves, their taken-for-granted assumptions about the world, and their attitudes toward others they may see as threatening, or even dangerous. Our participants have included: school teachers and principals, municipal workers, journalists, students, clerics, artists, NGO leaders, university professors and lawyers from Western and Eastern Europe, the Balkans, Asia, Africa and the Americas. BSSRPL programs strive to provide new, transferable skills that participants can then use in their home settings as tools for negotiating difference and coping with the discomfort that difference often invokes. Through our unique pedagogical approach which combines lectures, site visits, shared physical activities and hands-on learning, participants ultimately come to appreciate difference, while at the same time affirming their own particular communal identities.</p> <p>The BSSRPL is housed at the PU and our two-week program take place in Plovdiv as well as in the small villages in the surrounding Rhodope Mountains.</p>



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	We invite partners from universities and organizations throughout Europe who may be interested in our methods and approach to join with us in developing new models for “living with difference” in a rapidly changing world.
